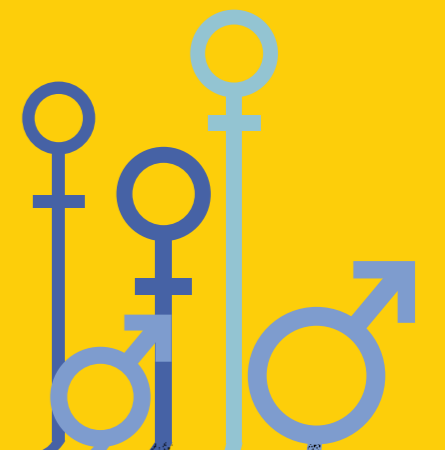

ABOUT NANHI KALI

Project Nanhi Kali was set into motion in the year 1996 by Anand G Mahindra, Chairman, KCMET; Chairman, Mahindra Group. Jointly managed by the K.C. Mahindra Education Trust (KCMET) and Naandi Foundation, this project strives to empower girls from socio-economically disadvantaged families to complete 10 years of formal schooling. Since its inception, Project Nanhi Kali has impacted the lives of 550,000 girls across 15 states, making it one of India's largest and most cost-effective sponsorship programs for the education of the girl child.

The project provides comprehensive support to girls in government schools from Classes 1-10, including daily afterschool remedial classes and access to an AI-powered, personalised, adaptive learning software via digital tablets. Every girl receives a material kit annually consisting of essential school supplies and feminine hygiene material. A professionally designed sports curriculum is integrated to promote holistic development. The project creates girl-friendly ecosystems in underserved communities across rural, tribal, and urban poor regions of India through regular engagements with parents and community stakeholders. Further, the project also introduced Nanhi Kali Life Skills and Digital Skills training programmes for teenage girls.

Moving in tandem with the UN Sustainable Development Goals 4-5 and the Government of India's 'Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao' initiative, Project Nanhi Kali extends the right to education to every girl. By empowering women within the community as educators and mentors, not only does the project foster simultaneous education and employment, but it also embodies an innovative program championed by women for the benefit of the women of the future, igniting a wave of empowerment and equality.



Our comprehensive aid includes:

- Daily academic support
- Access to digital tablets with personalised adaptive learning platform
- Supply kit inclusive of a bag, stationery, pullover/raincoat and feminine hygiene material
- Engagement with professionally designed physical education module
- Digital monitoring and documentation of progress and assessments
- Tutor interaction and follow-up with parents



CARVING PATHWAYS OF CHANGE

Like the tenacious water that reaches every empty space, Project Nanhi Kali's interventions have reached communities deprived of formal learning. With consistent and channelised efforts towards ensuring 10 years of schooling for girls, the Project has improved learning outcomes and successfully garnered over 90% programme retention rate.

Vasava, a grade 6 student at Samni P.S. School in Jambusar, Gujarat, had enrolled with Project Nanhi Kali in 2019.

Given her curious nature and eagerness to learn new things, she was excited to study at the Academic Support Centre. However, her life was soon deeply shaken by the death of her mother followed by her father. The consecutive loss of parents took a toll not only on her life but also her academics.

Left with her grandmother and a physically disabled grandfather, Vasava was compelled to help her grandmother sustain the family. She also joined her grandmother in doing household chores. Taking up these responsibilities at a young age led her away from school and the support centre.

When this absence was investigated by our community associate, she found out about Vasava's situation. She then visited her grandparents and convinced them to allow Vasava to resume her learning at school as well as the Academic Support Centre. After multiple visits and reassurances that her academic learning would be taken care of by Project Nanhi Kali, Vasava slowly started showing up at the Academic Support Centre.

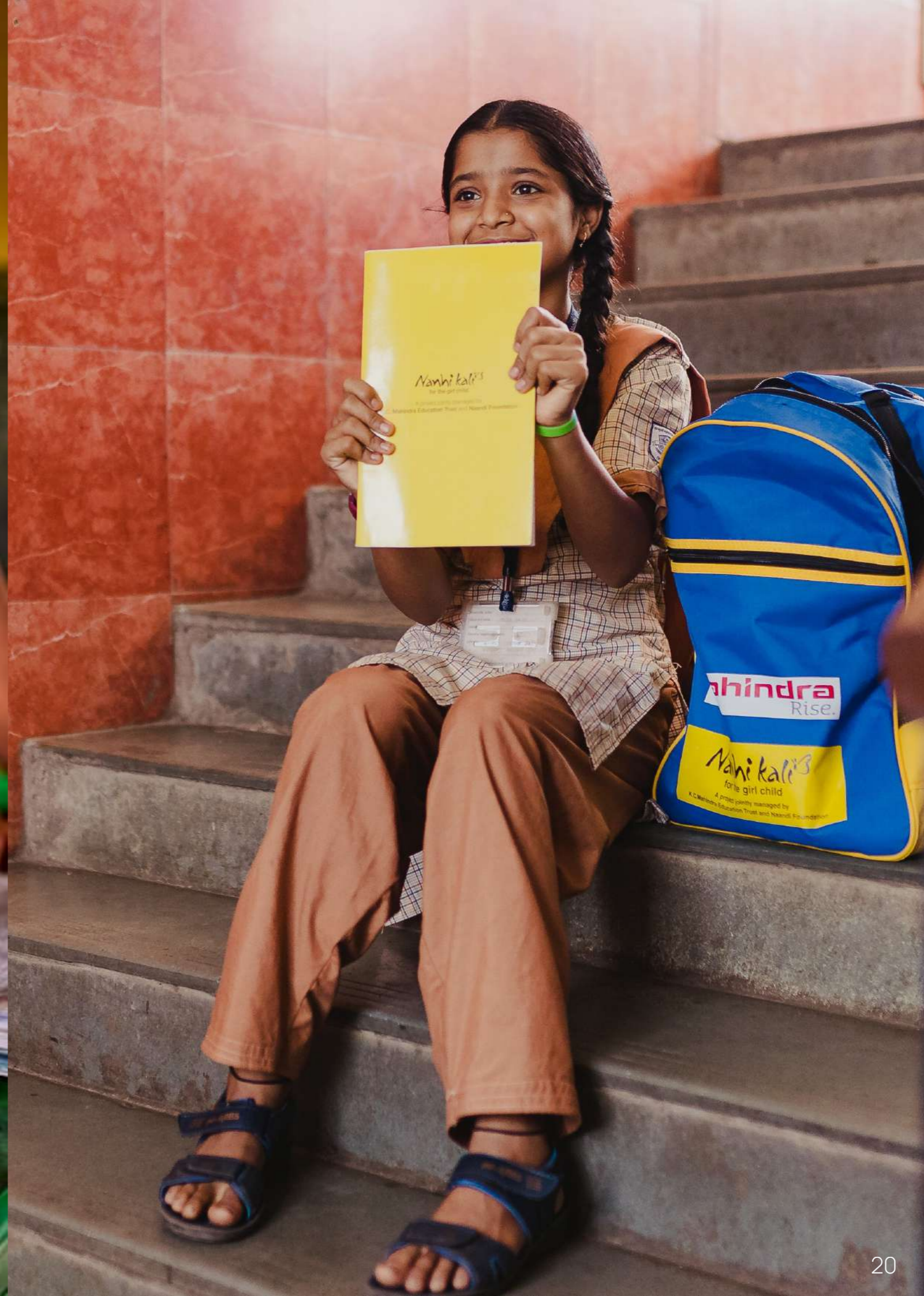
Though the academic break affected her temporarily, Vasava's learning curve remains undeterred. She has slowly started interacting with her friends at the Academic Support Centre and getting back to her education. Striving For Excellence Through Sports

Project Nanhi Kali introduced the Sports for Life programme into its curriculum framework in 2019.

In conservative villages, where education is considered a luxury, the Sports for Life Programme forges a revolutionary opportunity by inculcating a weekly sports lesson for the Nanhi Kalis. During these lessons, they learn not only about drills, leadership and teamwork but also gain knowledge about their bodies, nutrition and menstrual health. It further trains women from the communities to act as sports allies and tutors to the girls, thus propagating physical knowledge, strength and stamina for the girls and employment for women.

This culminates at the year end into an annual event called the Toofaan Games which invites female learners across 6,000 villages in 9 states to participate at village, district and national levels. It features four easy to facilitate events - 50-meter sprint, standing long jump, shuttle run, and endurance run that test the girls' agility and stamina.

Taking an interdisciplinary approach towards change has helped us reach people far and wide. Our events have become a platform for people to participate in and learn about the collaborative work undertaken by Project Nanhi Kali and Mahindra Pride.



Tata Mumbai Marathon 2023

The Tata Mumbai Marathon receives incredible support from passionate runners every year. This year, individual runners alongside corporate teams championed the cause of education for girls, garnering support for over 200 Nanhi Kalis. Through the Corporate Team challenge, the Mahindra Group together with companies like Titan Company Limited and Incred Finance ran in support of the project.

Digital and Life Skills Training Programmes

Held throughout the year, these training programmes aim to empower socio-economically disadvantaged adolescent girls between the ages of 16 and 19. This year, the programs implemented in Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu have supported a total of 31,908 girls. By developing soft skills, boosting confidence and helping the girls build a strong foundation for their academic and professional pursuits, these programs have successfully created new opportunities for them.



Proud Fathers For Daughters

Proud Fathers For Daughters envisions a change in the existing mindset and prejudices against girls. The annual charity event features celebrity photographers capturing the special bond between fathers and daughters.

This year, Project Nanhi Kali saw the seventh season of Proud Fathers For Daughters hosted on 12th and 13th November, 2022 at the World Trade Centre in Mumbai. Leading photographers like Atul Kasbekar, Colston Julian, Prasad Naik, Rafique Sayed, Jaideep Oberoi, Tarun Vishwa and Tejal Patni volunteered their time and talent to raise funds for the education of 358 Nanhi Kalis. Moreover, the event received the presence and support from notable figures such as the Joint Commissioner of Mumbai Police -Vishwas Nangre Patil, Suneil Shetty, Vidya Balan, Abhishek Bachchan, Esha Gupta, Mrunal Thakur, Pooja Hegde, and Boney Kapoor and sportsmen Suresh Raina and Mahesh Bhupathi.

Toofaan Games

Toofaan Games aspires to increase strength, stamina and participation of girls in sports. The event is organised across three levels: village, district and national. All girls enrolled in Project Nanhi Kali participate at the village level. The top performing athletes then qualify for the district level and ultimately, the best make it to the national level games.

This year the Toofaan Games, organised on 24th and 25th January 2023, marked its third season, bringing together 129 girls from across 19 districts of India. At every location, the Nanhi Kalis participated in a 50-meter sprint, standing long jump, shuttle run, and endurance run to test their strength and agility.



MAHINDRA PRIDE CLASSROOMS

According to McKinsey's The Power Of Parity Report, India has the chance to boost its GDP by \$770 billion by 2025 by improving the labour force participation of women by a margin of 10%. However, as of today, only 37% of women make up the country's labour force, largely categorised under the informal sector. Mahindra Pride Programme aims to change this reality in an unstoppable opportunity. Starting from the fiscal year 2022-23, the programme has transitioned to exclusively benefit women.

The Mahindra Pride Programme is the flagship CSR skill development training intervention by Mahindra and Mahindra Ltd. and Mahindra & Mahindra Financial Services Limited, implemented via the K.C. Mahindra Education Trust and Naandi Foundation. Under this programme the Mahindra Pride Classrooms [MPC] function as spaces to provide women with employability and entrepreneurial skills.

The Mahindra Pride Classrooms offer 40 to 120 hours of key employability skills module to final year students studying in Government Colleges, ITIs and Polytechnic Institutes. The pedagogy follows a blended learning approach by driving theory and real time application simultaneously. In addition to this, MPC appoints a full-time placement coordinator in every state to enable placement goals. To further secure employment, Job Utsavs or placement drives are conducted annually to bring together relevant employers and MPC alumni.

Akash John

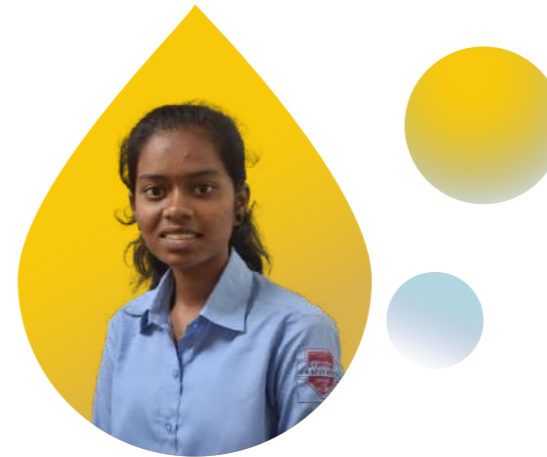
Thiruvananthapuram

In addition to this, he trains every afternoon for his examinations and encourages his sister to complete her higher education.
